Students will also be encouraged to earn the College Board's prestigious APID (Advanced Placement International Diploma), while enrolled in the program. The Problem

- 1. 11% of young Americans cannot place the USA on a world map while only 13% can correctly place the nation of Iraq.1
- 2. American high school students rank amongst the worst in the world in terms of geographic knowledge.1

The Solution

- 1. The creation of an international education program that guides and inspires highly motivated students throughout their four years at PVHS. Students will be enrolled in a variety of AP and honors courses in social science, English and foreign language with the goal of obtaining the knowledge and skills needed to be successful in the 21st century.
- 2. Students will be encouraged to also obtain the College Board's prestigious Advanced Placement International Diploma (APID), a globally recognized certificate for students with an international outlook. The APID challenges students to display exceptional achievement on AP Exams across several disciplines. Universities worldwide utilize the APID in admissions.



Palos Verdes International Diploma Requirements

- 1. Two semesters of World History Honors or AP and English 1 Honors.
- 2. Two semesters of the AP European History & English 2 Honors.
- 3. Two semesters of the AP US History & AP English Language.
- 4. Two years of a foreign language
- 6. Two semesters of the AP Human Geography/AP Comparative Government course.
- 7. One semester of AP Government or AP Economics
- 8. Completion of at least one of the after-school El Camino College or Los Angeles Harbor Community College courses covering an international topic (with counselor approval).
- 9. Participation in either Model United Nations (MUN) or Mock Trial or completion of either Comparative Religions or Advanced Philosophy.
- 10. The Junior and Senior Projects and Physical Project must be based on an International Studies topic.

APID Certification

To earn an APID, a student must earn grades of 3 or higher on at least five AP Exams in the following content areas:

English, foreign language, geography or comparative government, mathematics or science and one other subject of choice including, government, economics or art.
