The new freshman class seems very enthusiastic and we are hearing very positive comments from teachers about our freshmen. I hope that every day is a fantastic day for your kids. The reality is that there will "be bumps along the road." This is called life and I like to give parents some tips on this topic every couple years.


If you have a concern about a class, please start with the teacher. The same is true with an athletic team or any other extra curricular group. Our teachers, coaches and advisors can be reached by email or phone. If you contact a counselor or administrator, they would have to talk to the teacher or advisor anyway. These are the people who know exactly what the issue is so please start with them. If phone calls or emails are not returned, then contact a counselor or administrator. If you don't like what you see on Edline, or if you have a feeling deep down inside that your child is not spending enough time on homework, feel free to shoot a teacher an email. Students often will tell you what you want to hear. It is better to be proactive and check it out early. Ultimately parents will receive progress reports if students are not doing satisfactorily in class.

The Counseling Office is a resource. Students may see their counselor anytime by going into the office and filling out a slip. The counselor will call them in. This includes times when students are having some personal problems and just need someone to talk to. It is good for students to get to know their counselor. These are the people who will be writing their college letter of recommendation. Students must learn to take the initiative in developing a relationship with their counselor.

The College and Career Center is also a resource. You are welcome to just drop in and check out the facility. Teri Kuwahara, Crissy Cheney and Teresa Hoffman are all fantastic. They can be very helpful. It is important to register for Naviance as they send out information every Friday. There will be monthly sessions in the early evening on important topics such as writing the college essay, financial hardship and what to know about testing. Parents can also sit in when college admissions officers visit our school. We do ask that you listen and let the kids ask the questions. It is also very wise to let students make the college contacts when they have questions. If your son or daughter is not familiar with the College and Career Center, tell them to just go in, say hi and check it out. This is very important later in high school.

We expect this to be another great year. We are here to help so feel free to contact the appropriate office. When in doubt shoot me a call at extension 200.

From the PTSA President:

"Calm Seas Ahead

No pessimist ever discovered the secrets of the stars, or sailed to an uncharted land, or opened a new heaven to the human spirit. -Helen Keller

Being optimistic can cause people to want to slap your perky face or call you Pollyanna. But we're hoping that optimism is contagious, and that a perennial sunny outlook on the future will create an environment of discovery and new ways to solve the problems of the state budget crisis.

Thankfully, this forward thinking mentality is what led the voters to pass the Measure V parcel tax this summer, and the Peninsula Education Foundation to increase their pledge to the district to \$2MM, \$1MM going to teacher salaries. If those plans had not been put in place by very optimistic people, we would be looking at a much greater budget deficit. Currently, the state has reduced the PVPUSD budget by \$1,100 per student, or about \$13-\$14MM. Almost assuredly, more cuts will be imposed in the January revisions, due to continued lost revenue to the state.

What can we do? As a PTSA, we can continue to look for ways to cut costs and assist the school with basic needs that have been cut from the district. As parents, we can send copy paper, toner cartridges and other school supplies to your student's classroom. We can consider upping our donation to PEF to help achieve the increased pledge, or perhaps donate for the first time ever. Remember, PEF can pay for salaries, PTSA cannot. As volunteers, we can continue to find an hour here or there to help the school.

As announced last month, one of the biggest areas for cost savings was in discontinuing the printing and mailing of this newsletter, THE WAVE. Please let us know if you would like a copy printed and mailed to you by one of us on the board or you may pick up a copy in the front office. We are happy to do so, because staying connected to the school is one of the best ways you can help your child succeed and the best way to help the school. At the same time, by emailing it to you, we save \$18-\$20,000 that can be used to help the school and thus our students in other vital areas.

It is the perfect time for us all to hear the uplifting and motivational speech of <u>Scott Greenberg</u>, who is speaking to our students all throughout the day in assemblies on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>October 27th</u>, and again at <u>night</u> to us parents at the <u>night</u> PTSA <u>Meeting</u>, 7pm, in the MPR.



Tom O'Hern – Booster Club President – Mission Statement is to improve the quality of Arts, Athletics and Academics. Typically raise \$400,000 to \$450,000 per year. Kick-off party is Sept. 25.

Chris Bowles – Principal – Starting the year with 1844 students ('medium-sized' population for what is comfortable at PVHS). API scores rose from 854 to 865. Staff changes have been implemented in conformity with new budget. Bleachers anticipated replacement is February.



the premise that kids who are involved in service activities are less likely to take drugs or alcohol.



Update from PVHS College and Career Center

College Visit Sign Ups Now Available on Naviance

The 2009-2010 School Year is off to a great start and already 50 colleges and universities have signed up to visit the PVHS campus and talk to students in the College and Career Center. The first scheduled visit will be at 10 am, Friday, September 18th when University of Colorado Boulder's admission representative will be on campus. Interested Seniors and Juniors must sign up on Naviance and have teacher permission in order to attend info sessions during class time. Parents are welcome to attend, though we ask them to hold their questions or comments until after the admissions officer has the chance to address all student questions. Check the College Visit schedule on Naviance regularly as new visits are added throughout the week.

PSAT(Juniors): The Official PSAT Test is Saturday, October 17th Juniors may Register through Student Store October 5-12 between 9 am and 1 pm. (registration for interested sophomores opens October 8). The registration fee is \$20 and checks should be payable to PVHS. DO NOT BRING CHECKS PRIOR TO OCTOBER 5th. We will not have materials or test tickets until that date. The October 17th test date is a nationwide test date for the official PSAT. We hope this clarifies any confusion for parents and students who are receiving marketing materials for "practice" PSAT's and fee-based test prep services.

SAT and ACT Test Information:

All registration for SAT and ACT testing is done directly through the official testing organizations. Registration is currently underway for the October 10 SAT at www.collegeboard.com. Registration for the October 24 ACT is available at www.actstudent.org. Both sites have complete details about upcoming test dates, locations, deadlines and fees. Full length practice SAT and ACT tests, along with lessons, are available free to all PVHS students on Naviance through the Method Test Prep program, underwritten by the PVHS Booster Club.

College and Career Center Hours and Location

Girls Varsity Volleyball






