A Message From The Principal

We are pleased to announce that our bleachers at the stadium field will finally be replaced. This has been in the works for quite awhile and the funding is coming from district bond money. This has special meaning to staff and parents who have been with us since the school reopened. In 2001-02 we had a year to prepare for the reopening of Palos Verdes High School. While hiring staff and recruiting students we took on the task of working to make the 40 year old bleachers as nice as we could. This involved students and parents helping to scrape and paint the bleachers and weed the entire area. Replacement of these bleachers is the last piece of the puzzle in that area as we have already added our synthetic field and restrooms. The bid for this project will be approved by the Board of Education in early December and we think demolition and construction will follow in January or February.

We just added two new chemistry classrooms this year and on the horizon there are very preliminary plans for the construction of 5 new classrooms to replace some of our oldest portable classrooms on campus. This again will come with bond and possibly parcel tax money from the district. Our classrooms and other facilities are in pretty good shape. There was a major renovation on our campus in 2000-01 with district bond money. This included new tile, carpet, light fixtures and paint inside and outside for the entire school.

We have been creative in returning to a high school campus that was originally built in the late 1950's to be a middle school in the Los Angeles Unified School District. There was a time that classrooms were used for electronics, drafting, cooking and metal shop at PVHS. Today our College and Career Center is in the old cooking room, the drafting and electronics classrooms have been converted into a weight room facility, and the old metal shop now houses our PVIT program as well as scientific research and engineering classes. In addition the old typing room is now used for digital photography, an old home economics classroom has become the computer lab, and what used to be a school newspaper facility is currently used for our video production classes.

In a perfect world the old portables should all be replaced down the line. Thanks for your continuing PTSA and Booster Club support. This funding is vital to help support all the programs which are currently housed on our campus. Our students and staff are the beneficiaries.



Thanks to all who made College Day a success! The generosity of the PVHS PTSA and Academic Booster Club Committee made it possible for all students to take these preparatory college admission tests free of charge. This was a huge undertaking for PVHS in support of our college-bound culture.

Our testing numbers were as follows:

464 Freshmen took the EXPLORE test

457 Sophomores took the PLAN test

370 Juniors took the PSAT

We are awaiting the test results and planning evening "Give-Back" sessions for each of the tests.

PSAT Scores will be distributed on Wednesday, December 15 at 6:30 p.m. in the MPR. Score distributions for EXPLORE and PLAN to be announced.

The results of EXPLORE and PLAN will allow the staff at PVHS to compare our students with those on a national level and compare our college readiness standards in English, Mathematics, Reading and Science. It is also good preparation for the ACT, taken at the end of junior year or beginning of senior year. A career interest component in both tests will allow us to guide students to possible college majors and matching colleges. All of the data received from these tests will be very valuable in assisting our students with their prospective college planning.

PV DRAMA DEPARTMENT PRESENTS A COMEDY OF MYTHICAL PROPORTIONS

November 12-20

A comical play about the great Greek myths, "The Iliad, The Odyssey, and all of Greek Mythology in 99 Minutes or Less," will be presented by the drama department November 12-14 and 17-20. The play pokes fun at all of classic mythology, from the tragic love stories and follies of the gods, to the epic tales of famous heroes such as Hercules, Achilles and Odysseus.

Set on a simple stage, with the clock ticking in front of everyone's eyes, the cast of this offbeat play will race through updated, easy to understand and completely absurd versions of the famous Greek myths, including "The Iliad" and "The Odyssey," in just 99 minutes. Playwrights Jay Hopkins and John Hunter deliver sidesplitting comedy in every scene as the Greek tragedies are shown as sports highlights; vain gods walk the red carpet; great lovers appear on a dating show; and the creation of mankind becomes a botched subcontractor's job. All the silly decisions, outlandish destinies, and goofy characters are presented lightning-bolt fast with hysterical results, as the clock is stopped with only seconds to spare.

Since early mythology contains a multitude of characters, each actor in the production plays many roles, and all must quickly transition between as many as 15 different characters. Drama teacher Nicole Thompson directs the eight versatile cast members, which include Gillian Bozajian, Chris Chenoweth, Matt Fiedler, Annie Pfohl, Jeff Pielago, Allie Reidy, Monica Siouty and Spencer Tanner.

"Greek Mythology is the foundation of all storytelling, and everyone will recognize these timeless stories, even though they are told in a modern, hysterically funny tongue-incheek style in the play," says Nicole Thompson. "This will be a wild and zany evening of theater unlike anything audiences have ever seen before, and every age group will be in stitches."

COLLEGE COUNSELING GUIDEBOOK


Sophomore through Senior Year




